Children's Museum of Denver at Marsico Campus named a finalist for the Institute of Museum and Library Services 2018 National Medal

Museum honored for community service and focus on accessibility

Denver, CO. - March 5, 2018 - Today, the Institute of Museum and Library Services announced that the Children's Museum of Denver at Marsico Campus is among 29 finalists for the 2018 National Medal for Museum and Library Service.

The National Medal is the nation's highest honor given to museums and libraries for service to their communities. For 24 years, the award has celebrated institutions that demonstrate extraordinary and innovative approaches to public service. The 2018 National Medal seeks to honor institutions who strive to be accessible to all, despite financial and socioeconomic barriers.

Accessibility is a top priority for the Children's Museum of Denver at Marsico Campus. With the help of community partners, the Museum has developed and launched multiple access programs which strive to provide free family memberships, free or greatly reduced daily admission, and free school programs to children, families, and schools in need.

"The Children's Museum has worked tirelessly to ensure a visit to the Museum is within reach for all Colorado families," said U.S. Representative Diana DeGette. "The Museum offers multiple programs that provide free or greatly reduced admissions and memberships to at-risk Colorado families."

This year alone, the Museum provided nearly 100,000 admissions to children and families through multiple access avenues, which include the Sponsored Admissions and Memberships Program, the SNAP Access Initiative, and Growing Scientists: Sparking STEM in Early Childhood.

"The 29 National Medal finalists showcase the tremendous ability of libraries and museums to serve as vital community resources," said IMLS Director Dr. Kathryn K. Matthew. "The Institute of Museum and Library Services is honored to recognize these leading institutions. We congratulate them on the work they are doing across the United States."
