

Statement from the Children's Museum of Denver at Marsico Campus on Museum closure due to coronavirus:

March 13, 2020

The Children's Museum of Denver at Marsico Campus (the Museum), at the request of Colorado Governor Jared Polis and Denver Mayor Michael Hancock, will close in support of state and city efforts to combat the coronavirus/COVID-19. Following an order from the Governor of Colorado, the Museum will close to the public Saturday, March 14, 2020 and will remain closed until further notice.

It is important to clarify that there are no known cases of COVID-19 at the Museum. By closing, the Museum is doing its part to help the community with the "social distancing" that is necessary to slow the spread of the virus at this critical stage.

The Museum has been working closely with the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment and the Denver Department of Public Health and Environment and will continue to follow their guidance for cleaning and disinfecting the Museum and evaluating the next steps required to re-open our doors to guests.

The safety of our guests, staff and volunteers has been and will remain a top priority for the Museum. The Museum thanks you for your patience and your support as we move through the days and weeks ahead.

The Museum will continue to monitor and assess the situation as it evolves and will provide further updates as they become available.
